Healthwatch Islington has developed two workshops for its members and partners and the wider voluntary and community sector: <u>Community Engagement</u> on 24 November and the <u>Equalities Act</u> (2010) on 1 December. The courses are suitable for volunteers and paid employees and utilise a range of case study material drawn from health and social care settings.

Local Mental Health crisis telephone lines have recently been taken over by <u>Camden & Islington</u> <u>Foundation Trust</u>. There are two new numbers: 020 3317 6333 for those already under CIFT

care; 020 3317 6777 for those who are not. Both lines are open 24 hours daily, every day and are answered by clinicians.

Islington Mind's Enablement Service offers Islington residents with mental health problems, or a history of mental health problems, personalised time-limited support to enable them to maintain or achieve independent living. People can self-refer, or be referred by a statutory or voluntary organisation or their GP. An electronic referral form is available on the Islington Mind website.

Islington Clinical Commissioning Group's Social Sector Forum meeting took place on the 8 October. Papers from the meeting include the <u>agenda</u>, <u>notes of discussions</u>, and presentations on the <u>CCG's commissioning intentions</u> and the <u>Islington Adult Social Care & Joint Commissioning Market Engagement Strategy</u>.

A <u>free legal advice clinic</u> is running on Thursdays, from 1-2pm, at **Caxton House Community Centre**, thanks to **Burke & Niazi** solicitors.

The **Minister for civil society** has backed campaigning as a <u>'legitimate and valuable activity'</u> for charities.

A number of national charities have come together to form the <u>Strategic Alliance on Migrant</u> <u>Destitution</u> and have produced a useful report: <u>models of accommodation and support for migrants</u> <u>with No Recourse to Public Funds</u>.

The **Peel Centre** is hosting **Construction Youth Trust**'s <u>free taster courses in construction</u> for 14-30 year olds.

Funding & Support

Islington Giving is launching a new funding programme and campaign, It's Me it's You that challenges voluntary and community organisations in Islington to increase access and support for people with, or at high risk of developing poor mental health. With a focus on young people during its first phase, Expressions of Interest are now invited by 12pm 11 December 2015 from organisations that can help promote positive mental health and wellbeing for young people, aged 10-27, while preventing the escalation of problems that contribute to poor mental health. The third round of **Islington Council**'s <u>Community Chest Fund 2015/16</u> is open, with up to £5,000 available for community organisations that work with Islington residents and have an annual turnover of less than £100,000. The deadline for applications is **12 noon on Monday 11 January 2016**. Islington Council is running <u>free workshops and training sessions</u> designed to help organisations submit better bids to councils.

HMRC has published <u>new gift aid declarations</u> for <u>one-off donations</u>, <u>multiple donations</u> and sponsored events.

The **Directory of Social Change** is running two days of <u>practical fundraising training and information</u> for fundraisers at all levels. There will be 34 workshops over the 19 and 20 November 2015 at Resource for London on Holloway Road.

London Voluntary Service Council has a new <u>Partnership Directory</u> for organisations looking for **ESF** (Big Lottery, SFA or DWP) partners in London. It currently lists around 160 organisations, contains an advanced search function and allows organisations to upload and manage their own listing.

The three day <u>Leap Confronting Conflict</u> course explores young people's patterns of behaviour and participants are able to examine the difficult situations they face, identify the benefits of taking responsibility and consider new strategies when faced with conflict. Leap are particularly interested in working with organisations in Islington.

Communities interested in opening a community shop can apply for a grant of between £20,000 and £30,000 from Our Urban Shop. You will be required to be able to match fund by a range of other sources. **Deadline: 18 December 2015.**

The <u>Charity Governance Awards</u> celebrate outstanding governance in charities both small and large. Share your charity's work and win £5,000 to help you do more of it. **The deadline for entries is Friday 15th January 2016.**

Veolia Environmental Trust Funding can be granted within 5 cores categories: Community buildings, Parks and paths, Play and recreation facilities, Nature reserve and Supporting biodiversity. The average award is between £20,000 to £40,000 with a maximum of £100,000.

The **Skills Funding Agency**'s <u>Register of Training Organisations</u> has opened for applications. You need to be on the Register to apply as a lead partner or substantial subcontractor under the forthcoming SFA European Social Fund projects (which are due to launch imminently). It will close at **5.00 p.m. on Friday, 13 November**.

Consultations

A <u>consultation on Crossrail 2</u> is underway. The proposed new railway would run underground through London and through Islington via Angel. The proposals are at a very early stage of development and subject to funding and approval, the earliest the scheme could be open by is 2030. Drop-in consultation events will be held at Angel Station Central Piazza, 21 Parkfield St, London, N1 OPS, on the 16 and 17 November from 12 - 8pm. The consultation will run until **8 January 2016**.
