### **Network News and Information**

After the release of a London Metropolitan University report on the value of grant funding, commissioned by VAI, national organisations have teamed up to start the Grants for Good campaign. OK, the relationship might not be causal, but now that grants from the public sector make up only 5.5% of charity sector income, a decline of over 60% since 2004, it's time to get serious about their benefits.

**Voluntary Action Islington** has appointed Guljabeen Rahman to be its new Chief Executive. She will take up the role from 21st March 2016. As the current Chief Executive of VAI is a co-chair of ICN, Guljabeen will also take over that role until elections are due again in spring 2017. Guljabeen was most recently Director of the Hopscotch Asian Women's Centre in Camden and has also been a trustee of several community organisations. She has previously worked in the housing sector and internationally with UNICEF and VSO.

The next meeting of **Islington Health and Wellbeing Board** will be on 20 April 2016 at 1pm. Meetings are open to the public. See all information, including recent minutes, <u>here</u>.

The **Government** has announced it will be inserting a clause into grant agreements with charities that states funding cannot be used on activities intended to influence parliament, government or political parties. **NAVCA** has set up a petition for the government to reconsider.

Since charity accounts have been in the news, <u>Sayer Vincent</u> have published the latest in their series of simple guides to charity finance and management: <u>Reading charity accounts</u>.

**NCVO** has published <u>Welfare Reform: Voices from the Voluntary Sector</u>, a report on the impact of welfare reform. Some of its findings resonate with those of the ICN, Every Voice and Advising Islington Together report <u>'It's no fun being on benefits'</u>.

The **Cabinet Office** and the **Big Lottery Fund** have an online <u>VCSE Strength Checker</u> that aims to help small to medium sized organisations to analyse their organisation and identify areas that could be developed to improve organisational strength.

<u>Make It Work</u> is a new advice service from **Citizens Advice Islington** for low-paid or recently selfemployed people and owners of small businesses living or working in Islington.

The Islington Community Wellbeing Development Service has published a report on its last Quarterly Community Conversation, which had the theme: BMER communities and Cultural Competency in Mental Health Services in Islington. The council's Mental Health Commissioning Team has responded to the report's recommendations.

The <u>London LGBT Domestic Abuse Partnership</u> (DAP) is for LGBT people experiencing domestic violence and living or working in London.

## **Funding & Support**

Following consultation, **Cripplegate** will be continuing its <u>Main Grants Programme</u> and in addition will be launching a new Development Partner Programme and has written a <u>brief guide to the changes</u>. The <u>Community Chest grant programme</u>, in partnership with Islington council and overseen by a panel including Islington Community Network members, is open for applications for 2016/17. The deadline for applications to the first round of funding is **12 noon on Monday 9th May 2016**.

The <u>City of London Growing Localities Awards</u>, run by **City Bridge Trust** and **Lemos & Crane**, offer £5,000 prize money to projects based in any London borough that use nature to enhance the lives of

local citizens, young and old, as well as communities. The deadline for receipt of entries is **22 April 2016**.

Grants of between £500 and £1,500 are available from the **Hilden Charitable Fund** to run <u>summer play schemes</u> for the benefit of disadvantaged children aged five to 18 years. The deadline for applications is **20 May**.

**Starbucks** <u>Youth Action Applications</u> provide support and up to £1000 to help under-25 year olds not in employment or education to bring their social action project to life.

**UK Community Foundations** (UKCF) has created a £525,000 New Beginnings Fund to support refugees joining UK communities.

**Yapp Charitable Trust** makes grants for core funding to registered charities with a total annual expenditure of less than £40,000.

<u>BeyondMe</u> brokers relationships between teams of professionals ready to tackle causes they're passionate about and charity projects that can use their skills and time. By working on the project together the team and charity build a long-term partnership.

<u>Good Finance</u> is a new website that explains investment and finance options for charities and social enterprises.

**Better Community Business Network** provides <u>small grant awards</u> of up to £3000 per month to small but credible community projects, which are able to demonstrate the positive impact that they add to the local community
