The next meeting of **Islington Health and Wellbeing Board** is on the 6 July 2016, 1pm at Islington Town Hall. Meetings are open to the public. See all information, including recent minutes, <u>here</u>.

The <u>final report of the VCSE Review</u> commissioned by the **Department of Health**, **Public Health England** and **NHS England** has been published. Recommendations on how the VCSE sector can be supported to improve health, wellbeing and care outcomes relate to co-design, grant giving, the Compact and more, and may be useful when talking to Public Health and CCG partners.

The **Office for National Statistics** projects that <u>Islington's population will grow by 16.6% between 2014 and 2024</u>, the fifth biggest increase in the country.

The <u>Heatwave Plan for England</u> is intended to protect the population from heat-related harm to health.

**NCVO** has developed a free <u>Digital Toolkit</u> to help you plan, design and deliver a comprehensive digital skills development programme for your organisation.

**Islington Mind**'s <u>Enablement Service</u> offers Islington residents with mental health problems, or a history of mental health problems, personalised time-limited support to enable them to maintain or

## **Funding & Support**

**Islington CCG**, in partnership with Islington Council, has put out an <u>invitation to tender</u> for delivery of a community-based wellbeing initiative on the Andover estate. Please read the <u>specification</u> and <u>price schedule</u> and respond by **12 noon on 17 June 2016**.

**Public Health England** has announced an <u>HIV Prevention Innovation Fund</u> for 2016 to 2017 of up to £600,000 for local prevention initiatives.

**Help The Homeless** makes small grants to charitable organisations with the aim of helping homeless people return to the community and enabling them to resume a normal life.

The <u>Early Stage Support Programme</u>, funded by the **Nationwide Foundation**, offers expert mentoring and small grants to help affordable community-led housing projects get started.

**Islington Council**'s <u>Local Initiatives Fund</u> gives each ward £15,000 for grants for community projects recommended by local ward councillors.

The **Morris Charitable Trust** provides grants to community projects in Islington that relieve the deprived, sick and aged and advance education for the public benefit.

#### Consultations

The **Department of Health** has opened a <u>consultation on a new strategy to improve support for informal/unpaid carers</u> and wants to hear from carers, those who have someone care for them, business, social workers, NHS staff and other professionals that support carers. The consultation will close on **30 June 2016**.

The **Cabinet Office** is seeking views on proposed new policy directions for the allocation of Big Lottery Funds. The <u>Big Lottery Fund Public Consultation</u> closes at **12am on 12 August 2016.**
