About this Booklet

Please also contact the funders directly to obtain application forms and further information about the grants. To apply for any of the grants listed, you need a management committee, a governing document (constitution or memorandum & articles) and normally also a bank account, although some funders will allow another organisation to receive a grant on your behalf. You do not need to be a registered charity/company unless otherwise stated (however do check with the funder). Please note that many of the grant schemes are on-going. If you miss a deadline, there might be another round. Contact the funders directly to find out. The New additions are highlighted in blue both in the contents and on the pages.

They can then use social media, alongside traditional networks of friends, family and work acquaintances, to raise money.
